He does, however, run the risk of being thrown out and suffering any negative reactions of the crowd and the blemish on his record. He could lose the game, but he could win it too. For those of you unfamiliar with baseball, this metaphor could be just as easily explained in almost any venue. To state it simply, most worthy accomplishments are associated with risk. The person who is unwilling to encounter the one cannot expect to obtain the other. I've been teaching a study on the Book of Acts and the risks the early Christians took in establishing the Church were phenomenal. Where would we be today if they had not taken such personal risk? We've all heard nothing ventured, nothing gained. That becomes less clear when the word failure enters the picture. Catfish Hunter was a successful pitcher for the New York Yankees and recognized for his talent on the mound as well as his down to earth demeanor. He was from eastern North Carolina down around Ahoskie. He may have said it best when he said *"Winning isn't everything. Wanting to win is."* That sounds even better when you apply it in other areas. Winning, succeeding, profiting, any of these aren't always an achievable reward, but wanting to succeed or win for the right reasons makes you a winner already. If someone is pessimistic about an endeavor they may be proven right in the end, but an optimist will have a much better chance of moving things forward and will enjoy the process a whole lot more. There is a serious need to evaluate the difference between an acceptable risk and being careless, but a person unwilling to take a chance may find themselves stuck where they are. Maybe even first base.

From a personal perspective we all deal with our own ambitions and varying levels of wanting to excel each day. Doing what you love makes it much easier. As Helen Keller once said, *"One can never consent to creep when one feels the impulse to soar"*. I was amused yesterday when I saw the following quote: *My mother told me if I were to become a soldier I would be a General, if I became a monk, I'd become Pope. Instead I became a simple painter and wound up as Picasso. – Pablo Picasso*. As leaders it is necessary for us to not only advance ourselves, but advance causes and programs as well as assist others in advancing themselves. Accompanying that is the responsibility that occurs occasionally to offer advice on what risks are acceptable. We also end up in many cases policing what, when, and how advancements are attempted by others under our supervision. That is not an easy task. We have to convince ourselves and our staffs that to fail in one endeavor is never a true failure unless it breeds in us a desire to stop trying. There are some general philosophies that can give us

guidance. None of them are 100% effective all the time, but they are some I use and have often prevented me from making a mistake. Here are a few, and I'm sure you as a leader could add some:

- God is bigger than any problem I have;
- The formula for success is difficult to define, but one equation that will most often result in failure is to try and please everyone;
- Always try to do the right thing for the right reasons. Even if you find yourself confronted with the need to do the wrong thing, do it for the right reason;
- Sitting on the fence makes it as easy to fall backward as forward, and not many will have the confidence to bet on which way you will fall.
- As my High School football coach used to say, *"luck is opportunity met with preparation"*;
- If you consider your head and your butt at both ends of your spectrum, your success may well be determined by which you use the most;
- Making people believe you and trust you is an absolutely fundamental quality of success;
- Success comes before work only in the dictionary – Anonymous;
- The lesser of two evils is still an evil;
- Being a person of ideals and value is more important than being a person of success. As Albert Einstein once said, *"try not to become a man of success, but rather a man of value"*;
- You will make mistakes, but never make the mistake of being the person who claims he's never made one;
- Surround yourself with positive people. Not stupid or reckless, just positive;
- *A winner never quits, and a quitter never wins* – Anonymous;
- Some endeavors require a long jump, with no safe middle landing place. Evil Keneival found out you can't jump the Grand Canyon by making two shorter leaps;
- I'd rather fail at trying to do the right thing than succeed at doing the wrong. I also recognize that accomplishment with poor values or tricks isn't enjoyed very much.

- If you're going to stumble, stumble forward;

- If you ever reach the top, or arrive at where you set your sights, you'll be remembered more for how you got there than where you're at.

Many have a different view of success, and any goal will mean more to one than another. The truth is, for our personal success what is important to us is of utmost importance. Success may be closer than you think. I'll leave you with this final quote from Ralph Waldo Emerson which has been used thousands of times by famous people who worded it differently;

*To earn the appreciation of honest critics, and endure the betrayal of false friends;*

*To appreciate beauty;*

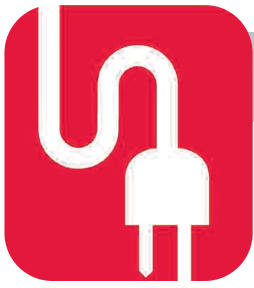
*To find the best in others;*

## Product Safety

In a recent web search for questionable products, the website [www.made-in-china.com](http://www.made-in-china.com) boasted a "Circuit Breaker", "CE" marked only. Here's the exact wording from the manufacturer:

**Product Description.** *DZ47-63(C45N) series circuit breaker is used in lighting distribution system or motor distribution system for protecting overload and short circuit in the system. The product is neoteric in structure, light in weight, reliable And excellent in performance. Its frame and parts adopt plastics of high fire resistant and shockproof. The product, with long life, is mainly used in AC 50Hz/60Hz single pole 240V or two, three, four poles up to 415V circuit for Overload and short circuit protection, as well as for unfrequently switching on&toff electric equipment and lighting circuit in normal case. The products comply with IEC 60898 & GB10963-1999.*

Notice the wording "*The products comply with IEC 60898 & GB10963-1999*". This is very common language on "CE" only marked products and other products where the manufacturer has not bothered to assure compliance with Standards. If you read between the lines, it might actually read "We never had this tested by electrical safety professionals but you can trust us..."

This brings up many question that cannot be answered satisfactorily, because it would be difficult to ask the manufacturer. The main questions is: Is it a Circuit Breaker? The answer is No. In fact, the IEC (International) Standard referred to is severely limited in scope, and is nowhere close to our US Standard for Circuit Breakers, UL 489.

## Safety Reminder

**Personal Protective Equipment.** Feb 13th, 2008 OSHA made PPE mandatory for employers to provide. Of course, if the employer's policy is to NOT work on live equipment, then this will not apply to you. However, the reality is that many people in the electrical field perform live work even in the policy is not to. For example, even standing in front of an open control panel that is energized requires a level of PPE. The implications are serious for facilities, Contractors, Engineers, Utilities employees and many others. More information is available on the OSHA website. You can see the actual wording of the law

by going to [www.osha.gov](http://www.osha.gov) and typing in 1910.132 into the "Search" box. Use the link that says "General requirements".

**Hearing protection.** Although the Occupational Health and Safety Administration (OSHA) has established standards to protect workers from hearing loss due to workplace noise-and employers for the most part attempt to comply with the rules-many employees often "forget" to wear hearing protection because they deem it uncomfortable, or they remove it for varying periods of time, or they select earplugs that do not fit properly.

Because the effect of exposure to elevated noise levels is cumulative, and hearing loss is usually gradual, the onset of deafness may not become apparent for years. Thus, many workers seem to feel there is no immediate downside when they fail to follow the rules laid down by their employer.

OSHA estimates some 30 million workers are regularly exposed to noise levels that are eroding their ability to hear ambient sounds and normal conversation. The Better Hearing Institute reports that a similar number of Americans already have some degree of hearing impairment.

Any noise louder than 80 decibels (dB) for prolonged periods of time can contribute to hearing loss. In that category are lawn mowers, snow and leaf blowers, helicopters, motorcycles, chain saws, snow-mobiles, shop tools, rock concerts, jet engines, gun shots, heavy truck traffic, machine tools, and construction equipment.

**Non-Certified Machinery.** Remember that the new NC General Statutes allows an Inspector to report potentially unsafe / non-certified electrical equipment and industrial machinery directly to OSHA.

On this page, you will see the statement: "Anyone who knows about a workplace safety or health hazard may file a complaint, and OSHNC will investigate the concerns reported". NCFMA is partnering with the NC Association Fire Chiefs, the NC State Firemen's Association, the NC County Fire Marshals Association and many other fire service related organizations to promote residential fire sprinkler education and to support changes to State and International Codes to require sprinklers in new one and two family construction.

The NCFMA is working closely with the NC Home Fire Sprinkler Alliance and Fire Team USA to educate firefighters, code officials and the public about residential fire sprinklers.

The NC Building Inspector's Association has joined hands with us in supporting changes to the NC Residential Building Code to require sprinklers in new construction.

The NCFMA feels that residential sprinklers in combination with working smoke detectors in one and two family dwellings will greatly reduce fire deaths in NC and across our nation.

The criteria to satisfy for eligibility for a scholarship award are as follows:

1. The student applicant shall be a spouse, child, or dependent of a living mechanical inspection certificate holder who is working for a building inspection department of the City, County, or State Government, and further that such City, County, or State Agency or department shall be an active member of the NC Mechanical Inspectors Association for at least five (5) years. The mechanical inspection certificate holder shall be an active mechanical inspector with a minimum of five (5) years' mechanical field inspection and/or plan review experience, beginning minimally with a probationary certificate. In order to be eligible for a scholarship, the jurisdiction must be in good standing in payment of Association dues.

2. The student applicant shall agree that the use of grant funds shall be predicated on his or her enrollment or continuance of education in a recognized and/or accredited school such as a college, university, trade school, business college, or as may be acceptable to the NC Mechanical Inspectors Association Scholarship Committee and Board of Directors.

3. The applicant shall possess qualities of good character and integrity.

4. The applicant shall provide a record or evidence of satisfactory scholastic or school grades, ability, ambition, and desire for continuance of education.

5. The grant of funds may be utilized by a student for continuance of succeeding year or years upon satisfactory academic progress, subject to review by the NC Mechanical Inspectors Association Scholarship Committee. The maximum number of years that funds may be granted a student is four (4) years. All students desiring continuation of funding must apply each year by submitting this application form.

6. Application deadline is July 24, 2008. Please note that there is a new scholarship application that replaces the application used in past years. Only the new application will be accepted. The applicant's file must be complete by July 24, 2008 to be eligible to be considered for scholarship. Applicants are encouraged to complete their submission and supporting materials required well in advance of this date.

## The New 2006 NC Building Code Is Based on the 2003 International Building Code

The new 2006 NC Building Code is modeled from the 2003 International Building Code and became effective July 1, 2006. The new NC Building Code Volumes for Mechanical, Gas, and Energy are based on the 2003 editions of the corresponding ICC codes with the inclusion of NC amendments. One very significant change approved by the NC Building Code Council was to eliminate the mechanical, gas, and plumbing sections from the 2006 NC One and Two Family Dwelling Code. The 2006 NC One and Two Family Dwelling Code references the 2006 NC Mechanical, Gas, and Plumbing Codes for requirements. This means that all plumbing, mechanical, and gas requirements **will be contained in one respective code book for each discipline**. Please make sure the contractors in your jurisdiction understand this important amendment.

Generally, the new 2006 Edition of the NC Building Code includes the amendments included in the 2003 International Code that were approved since the 2000 ICC codes were published, the NC specific amendments from the 2002 NC Building Code that the ad-hoc committees moved forward, and any separate amendments approved under the rules review procedures since the adoption of the 2002 NC Building Code. Also, an accompanying commentary is being prepared for each volume of the NC Building Code. The commentaries will be modeled from the 2003 ICC commentaries and will be revised to reflect NC amendments.

## Development of the 2009 NC Building Code

Ad hoc committees were formed and work has been completed on the next edition of the NC Building Code. The 2009 NC Building Code is being modeled upon the 2006 ICC codes and will include NC amendments. The planned effective date for the 2009 NC Building Code is January 1, 2009

## Mechanical Code, Gas Code, and Energy Code Interpretations on the Web

The NC Department of Insurance is placing interpretations of the 2006 NC Building Codes on-line on the DOI web-site. These interpretations can be viewed, downloaded, and printed. other important information can be viewed from the NC DOI web-site.

# North Carolina Code Officials Qualification Board

The next quarterly meeting is scheduled for April 22, 2008 at 1:00 PM. The agenda for each quarterly meeting can be found on our website at [www.ncdoi.com](http://www.ncdoi.com).

## Presentation of Fifth Standard Level III Certificates

Chairman Lutterloh presented the following individuals with their fifth Standard Level III Inspection Certificate: Tony Beasley of the Town of Garner Inspection Department, Alan Edwards of the Pitt County Inspection Department, Kevin O'Brien of the City of Wilson Inspection Department, James Pruitt of the Town of Wake Forest Inspection Department, and Stephen Winthrop of the Catawba County Inspection Department.

The number of individuals achieving this level of certification is currently 171.

## Disciplinary Actions from October, 2007 through January, 2008

### Voluntary Settlement Agreement

Staff presented a proposed voluntary settlement agreement in the disciplinary hearing against Kure Beach inspector John Batson. A complaint was filed against Batson concerning building code defects concerning commercial building. Mr. Batson has agreed to a suspension of his ability to conduct any commercial building inspections for a period of one year and to spend a minimum of one year training in the field for commercial building inspection in Kure Beach under the direction of New Hanover County Inspections.

### Voluntary Settlement Agreement

Staff presented a proposed voluntary settlement agreement in the disciplinary hearing against Carolina Beach inspector Van Paxton. A complaint was filed against Paxton concerning building code defects concerning residential and commercial buildings. Mr. Paxton has agreed that his Building Certificate shall be reduced from level III to level II and will remain at level II until he has successfully completed a Level III Building class and passed a level III Building Certification exam, he shall take and pass an ICC Plan Review class within six months and shall spend two eight hour days weekly for two months in training with New Hanover County inspections staff. The first month will be spent in plan review and the second month conducting field inspections.

### Voluntary Surrender of Certificate

Staff presented a Voluntary Surrender of Certificate in the disciplinary hearing against Charlotte fire inspector Tamara Smith. A complaint was filed against Smith concerning affixing her signature to inspection reports when she had not performed any inspections. Smith formally surrendered her Standard Level III Fire Inspection Certificate.

## Continuing Education Program Requirements

As a reminder for current and new inspectors, continuing education is

required for all code enforcement officials holding active standard or limited certificates. As a condition of certificate renewal, six hours of continuing education must be completed for each active limited or standard certificate per renewal year (by June 30 each year) in each technical area. An individual possessing both an active limited and standard certificate valid for the same area will only be required to complete six hours in that technical trade. Since we are starting the second year of our program, this is an important item to remember: **A code enforcement official can only receive credit for the same course once within a three-year period.** If continuing education credit is not completed for a specific technical trade, the standard or limited certificate for that area will be suspended until the educational requirement is completed. This will impact your ability to perform your job duties.

## Program Update

The second year of the inspector continuing education program is nearly complete and there have been many changes to improve the program. The staff is now requiring all continuing education credits to be transmitted by e-mail by an Excel transmittal form. The electronic download has worked well and allows the staff the ability to download directly into our database reducing the number of errors and improving efficiency. Requests for course approvals are usually processed within one week of receipt and notification of approval or denial is sent by e-mail. Hopefully this timetable will allow each sponsor and instructor the ability to schedule and complete training within a reasonable time.

Currently, we are preparing a document that will show each individual with an active standard or limited certificate and the number of hours of continuing education completed for renewal years 2007 and 2008. This report will also show any carryover hours available for renewal year 2009. This report will be available on the NC Department of Insurance website at [www.ncdoi.com](http://www.ncdoi.com) by April 14, 2008. You will be able to search this document using your certificate number or name to find your information. We will update this document on a monthly basis. Remember that some courses may not show up as quickly as you complete them. Reporting is dependent upon the date the sponsor e-mails the course credit to us.

Since each sponsor is transmitting all continuing education credits electronically, it is imperative that you provide the instructor with your Standard or Limited Certificate number.
