Question:

When are Material Safety and Data Sheets (MSDS) required to be kept on the premises after the Certificate of Occupancy has been issued?

Answer:

In accordance with Section 407.1, if the quantity of hazardous materials stored within the building meets the thresholds for the application of a permit in accordance with Section 2701.5 or where required by the code official, the MSDS will need to be readily available on the premises.

It is important to note that the permit quantities identified in the code are used to determine a threshold for when a hazardous material represents a significant danger and subsequently become the trigger for when the MSDS is required to be kept on the premises. Portions of the fire code that make the application for a permit optional do not negate this requirement.
