Safe Kids NC works to prevent unintentional childhood injury, the #1 cause of death among children in North Carolina.

Three out of every five home fire deaths resulted from fires in homes with no smoke alarms or alarms that were not working.

>117,965 smoke alarms have been installed since 2012.

>743 deaf and hard-of-hearing alarms have been installed since 2010.

> 6,825 carbon monoxide alarms have been installed since 2010 Medications are the leading cause of accidental poisoning deaths among children.

>422 Million

Prescription and over-thecounter pills have been safely disposed of since 2010, saving countless lives as well as the environment. >500 permanent medication drop-off sites have been established in local communities statewide. Motor vehicle-related injuries are the #1 cause of death among children ages 5–19.

When used correctly, child safety seats lower the risk for injury by up to 82%.



> 6,398 child passenger safety seats were checked since 2010.

Permanent Checking Stations are open statewide to educate North Carolinians on passenger safety and the proper installation and use of child safety seats.
