
Safe Kids NC works to prevent unintentional childhood injury, the #1 cause of death among children in North Carolina.

Three out of every five home fire deaths resulted from fires in homes with no smoke alarms or alarms that were not working.

> 117,965
smoke alarms have
been installed
since 2012.



> 743 deaf and hard-of-hearing alarms have been installed since 2010.



> 6,825
carbon monoxide alarms have
been installed since 2010

Medications are the leading cause of accidental poisoning deaths among children.

> 422 Million

Prescription and over-the-counter pills have been safely disposed of since 2010, saving countless lives as well as the environment.

> 500

permanent medication
drop-off sites have been
established in local
communities
statewide.



> 4,607 Operation Medicine Drop Take-Back Events
have been held across the state since 2012.

Motor vehicle-related injuries are the #1 cause of death among children ages 5–19.

When used correctly, child safety seats lower the risk for injury by up to 82%.


